Accounting continues to be one of the leading professions worldwide. Moreover, the demand for accountants in public practice, industry, and government continues to remain strong. The objective of our program is to prepare students for careers in public or private accounting sectors, or related professions, such as banking and IT industry. Curriculum Design

Our program is guided by two underlying principles: 1) students must learn not only accounting theory but also be able to incorporate relevant theories into practical application; and 2) traditional accounting practices must be conjoined with advances in modern information technology to achieve a unified approach.
